Dear Parents and Carers,

This has been a very different half term. I cannot believe it has only been six weeks. Thank you for all your hard work, for supporting your children and completing remote learning at home. We all understand how difficult it has been for many of you.

I would also like to thank all those parent/carers that have not taken advantage of being classed as a critical worker and only sending their children into school when really necessary. Working together in this way will have stopped some transmission of the virus and am sure will have saved lives. Thank you.

Everyone at both schools will be listening to Boris Johnson's route out of lockdown that is due to be announced in the near future. We are hoping that all children will return to school very soon.

#### Certificates

Each week teachers are identifying children that are working really hard in school and at home. I am really enjoying my Friday afternoon visits around Deepcar and Stocksbridge handing out certificates to remote learners. It has been fantastic to touch base with so many families and catch up with your children albeit at a social distance! (For reference, all certificates are wiped with anti-bacterial spray and I use hand sanitiser between each house visit.)

#### Lexia

After monitoring usage of Lexia only 50% of pupils with a license have accessed the program in the last three weeks. Therefore we will be changing access to different children. For parent/carers who have already contacted school to discuss access issues, your child will still have access but usage will have to be monitored. I hope everyone understands that we simply cannot waste the huge amount of money the system has cost for it not to be used.

If you need a device to access online learning please do contact school. If you have two children sharing one device also contact school as we may be able to offer another. These will be prioritised to children identified as Pupil Premium in the first instance.

The Local Authority have been very quick to respond to school's needs and have allocated a few more laptops to Deepcar St John's.
