#### This week:

As part of English the children have analysed their Little Red Riding Hood stories. Children read their own piece of writing and checked whether they had met each step for success (story language, past tense, coordinating conjunction 'and', punctuation and ambitious words).

As part of Maths the children have had to use their place value knowledge to look carefully at the value of the number and then write it correctly spelling the number in words. The children have also been given the number in words and asked to read it and then write the number in digits. The challenge this week has been for children to identify incorrect spellings and correct these themselves.

Can your child write numbers from 1-100 in words?

Can they spell them correctly?

Can they read the number in words and write the number in digits?

The children's topic this half term is 'Memory Box'. In our Science lessons this week, children have learnt the names of the different animal groups based on what they eat - herbivores (eat plants), carnivores (eat meat) and omnivores (eat both plants and meat). The children then sorted a group of animals into the correct columns on their grid.

Carnivore Animals that only eat meat.	Omnivore  Animals that eat both plants and meat.	Herbivore Animals that only eat plants.

Can your child name the different groups and say what they eat? What is a lion (herbivore, carnivore or omnivore)? What is a human (herbivore, carnivore, carnivore, carnivore)? What is a sheep (herbivore, carnivore or omnivore)?

# Spellings

Spellings are handed out in phonics lessons every Thursday and your child will be tested on these spellings the following Thursday.

Children will receive a list of spellings to practise each week. In addition to the spellings, children will be tested on a sentence containing the words. However, the sentence will not be sent home. This is to see if they can apply the spelling currently within their writing. Can you get your child to practise applying the words by creating their very own sentences?

# Reading Diaries

Children in KS1 have all been provided with a Home Reading Diary. Please fill this in daily based on your child reading a couple of pages of a book or a whole book. Please return the Reading Diary to school each day and leave it in the designated classroom tray. There are books situated in the classroom for your child to take home when they have finished the book they are reading. Reading is extremely important to your child's development so we really encourage your child to read a book or pages of a book daily. If you are unsure of your child's reading book colour then please ask your teacher.
