Attendance: [class 1](#) – 88.5% and [class 2](#) – 96.2%

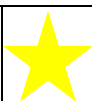
After the holidays

Homework

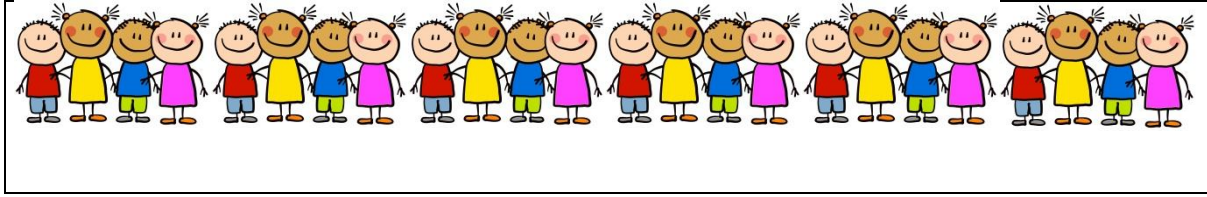
